Minutes.

Minutes of meeting held on 15th May 2018 were duly approved by the Council.

Finance

Our balance stands at £13,080.72, and after paying £6.50 for special delivery for the submission of accounts to external auditors PKF KLittlejohn our petty cash stands at £1.80. It was agreed £100 should be paid to the clerk for expenses and reimbursements and £41 for subscription to the SLCC

Broadband.

It was reported that Voneus were expected to implement broadband from St.Margaret's church though there was still work to be done to get line of sight to all properties. It was discussed whether planning permission for the mast would be needed and Councillor Barclay will make enquiries.

Foothpaths.

From a telephone call to Mr Andy Turner, chasing up the clearing of footpaths in Warburton, it seems he is moving on but all the information on footpath clearance has been passed on to his superior Mr Mark Fleming. He will be e-mailed regarding further work.

Toll Bridge

Since the disappearance of the toll booth, traffic has been flowing smoothly through the village causing no hold ups. There was a meeting of the Warrington Toll Action Group in Partington which updated residents on the situation. A toll is only collected in one direction at a time though there had been confusion as no tariffs were on display in the new toll booth. Investigations are underway to confirm Peel Ports are able to collect tolls. The sequence of the traffic lights to the A57 had been adjusted to make sure there was no back up of traffic into Warburton village.

Correspondence. Manchester Airport had e-mailed regarding their draft noise action plan 2019-2023. Ian McCavery had e-mailed regarding Crime and Community Safety engagement events in Trafford. A walking football group had set up near the Trafford Centre. Elaine Clipson had e-mailed the council concerned about damage to the church from construction of HS2 and road realignment. A resident highlighted concerns that the speed sign was still not working. A letter had been written from the council supporting planning application 94048/FUL/18. It was agreed that Catherine Bell, who had contacted the Parish Council about metal detecting, should contact Richard Clegg

Planning.

There were no further planning applications.

Defibrillator. We are still awaiting information from the Saracen's Head.

Speed Sign We are still waiting for work to be carried out on the speed sign.

Complaints Procedure A draft complaints procedure was presented to council. This is being considered and amendments required will be reported at the next meeting.

Flooding Nothing has yet been done regarding the flooding at the junction of Dunham Road and Carr Green Lane where the resident of Lane End Cottage has been experiencing flooding onto the property.

Village Signs A letter has been sent to Trafford regarding the sad condition of the village signs and asking for new ones.

Any other business. Following local elections the GMSF consultation has been delayed. Redrow, who had been attempting gas testing in the area have gone quiet. All councillors agreed that under clarification of GDPR all e-mails can be addressed to add instead of BCC.
